Jejunal diverticula are more common and are larger than those found in the ileum. These are multiple false diverticula which usually protrude from the mesenteric border of the bowel. Often overlooked during celiotomy, this condition may be associated with one of three syndromes: systemic sclerosis, visceral myopathy, or visceral neuropathy (Schwartz, Shires, Spencer. *Principles of Surgery*. 6th ed. Page 1179).
