About the Cover

Sickle cell anemia, a hereditary hemoglobinopathy, is characterized by the presence of sickle and crescent-shaped erythrocytes. Normal Hb A is replaced with sickle hemoglobin (Hbs) and other hemoglobin variants. Skin ulceration is a complication of a sickle cell crisis.
