About the Cover

Pseudocysts represent more than 75% of the cystic lesions of the pancreas. They are localized collections of pancreatic secretions that lack an epithelial lining and occur as a result of surrounding tissues walling off a duct disruption. These cysts contain high concentrations of pancreatic enzymes, are often associated with acute pancreatitis, and are clearly defined by computed tomographic scanning.
